## SERVICES OFFERED

The Monmouth County Fire Academy offers a full range of courses for the winter/spring months. Also the Academy will offer the usual package of drill and specialty topics that can address specific department needs. Any specific classes or academy outreach programs can be offered by special request. Any subject not on the regularly scheduled programs, drills or outreach programs, must be requested by filling out and faxing a class request form.

## COURSE PREREQUISITES

Prerequisites as needed are indicated in the course description for each program. If a student has taken a course that is a prerequisite at another agency the student must supply a copy of a certificate of course completion.

## COURSE REGISTRATION

Registration forms must be completely filled out and submitted prior to the start of the class. Students are asked to be consistent with their names. Please, do not use nicknames and or initials as it causes confusion with computer data entry.

## CANCELLATIONS

If a student has to cancel, please notify the Academy as soon as possible by phone, to enable us to fill the vacancy. You can put another member in the vacancy.

## ATTENDANCE

Students will be responsible for signing the class roster both in and out of each session. In order to be evaluated and to be issued certification a student must have a 100% attendance and complete all practical activities as required by each course. If the student does not have 100% attendance the certificate will be held until completion. Students must request a makeup date with the academy in person or by phone, they cannot just show up.

Students are not permitted to leave the academy prior to class dismissal without notification to, and permission of, the Instructor in charge. Any student reporting late for class should notify the Academy by phone and report to the office to sign in before reporting to class.

## FOOD

Vending machines are available at the Academy. For lunches, students may bring their lunch or use the catering service available for full day classes. Students will not be allowed to leave the facility at lunchtime.

## USE OF THE FACILITY

Because of the many activities at the academy it is imperative that all Fire Departments request use of academy's facilities as far ahead as possible. Please! **Do not** come to the Academy if you have not made reservations beforehand.

## ACADEMY CLOSING

# **SPECIAL TRAINING NOTICES**

## SCBA RESPIRATORY FIT TESTING

The New Jersey, PEOSH currently requires ongoing respiratory training for all Firefighters and Officers, part of the training includes an annual qualitative facepiece fit test. To aid Departments in meeting these requirements the Academy will perform, if requested, a qualitative facepiece fit-test.

Fire Academy offers SCBA fit testing to Monmouth County Fire Companies and Departments.

These tests will be carried out when Companies/Departments use the Academy's Smoke House. The academy must know ahead of time if you want Fit-Testing during your Smoke House session.

Individual "Respirator Fit Test Records" will be issued for each Firefighter tested.

## SMOKE HOUSE AND FIREGROUND USE AT THE FIRE ACADEMY

To comply with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134 and NJAC 5:18-2.5, from the Division of Training and Certification, the following procedures for use of the Fire Academy Smokehouse must be adhered to:

- The LIVE BURN PROTOCOL for SMOKEHOUSE USE form is to be completed prior to any entry to the smokehouse is made.
- An Incident Commander, Site Safety Officer and Instructor in Charge must be designated.
- The Instructor in Charge must be a Level II Instructor, SCBA/Smoke House and Live Burn certified, by the Division of Fire Safety. A Department/Company using the facility may use the Fire Academy
- Instructor, on site, to fill this position if needed and requested.
- All Instructors on site are to be listed by name and certification number.
- The Fire Academy must have a list of all participants certifying that they are qualified firefighters and comply with the current Respiratory Standard, by the Incident Commander, before any Smokehouse entry is made. All forms will be supplied.
- Fireground Check List: To be completed: by IC, Safety Officer, Instructor in Charge, and the Academy on-Site Instructor.
- Participant Briefing: To be completed by: Instructor in Charge

## Special Note:

All firefighters and organizations using the Smoke House are to comply with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134 the current Respiratory Protection Program enforced by the New Jersey Departments of Health and Labor.

## FIREFIGHTER I CERTIFICATION - RE-TEST

Any student, who has completed the Firefighter I training and has failed the DCA, Division of Fire Safety's test for certification under NJAC 15:18C, will have an opportunity to retake the certification test. A passing grade of 70% is the minimal for certification. Any student wanting to re-take this exam must contact the Academy for scheduling.

## ELECTRICAL FACILITY

Any Department/Company can request the Live Electrical Facility training course. Arrangements can usually be made to fit your schedule. A minimum of 20 students is required. For further information contact the Academy.

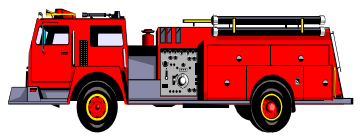

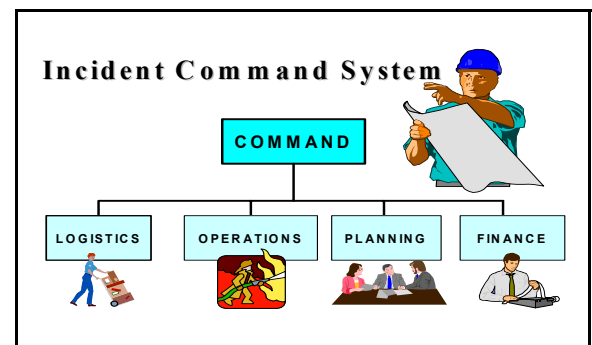

This mandated training program for all first responders regarding appropriate recognition and response techniques when encountering any individual who has autism or any other developmental disability.

Monmouth County Fire Academy is located at 1027 Highway 33 East, 1/2 mile east of the Cabin Restaurant.

From NJ Turnpike Exit 8, take 33 East approximately 19 miles to the Academy which will be on the left side.

Take Garden State Parkway to Exit 100, follow signs to 33 West, approximately 12 miles; Academy is on the right side.

Take I-195 South (EXIT 7A on NJ TPK) approximately 10 miles to Rte 537 East (Freehold), take 537 East for approximately 9 miles to Rte 33 East. Take 33 East for approximately 6 miles; Academy is 1/2 mile past Cabin Restaurant, on the left side.
